The Tale of the Whale

"How the Westover Wild Waves became the Westover Wild Orcas"

Roth Feeley was a student at Hill Elementary, Murchison Middle School and a member of the Westover Wild Waves Swim Team during the 1990's. He loved to swim, had an infectious personality, keen intelligence, an amazingly extensive knowledge of whales in general and an enthusiasm for Orcas in particular. In January of 1996 the Westover Wild Waves community lost Roth Feeley. Roth was the son of Kristen and Michael Feeley who were an intrinsic part of the Westover Hills Club; Kristen served in various volunteer positions on the Westover swim team. Roth's younger brother, Coleman, who was five years old and had just finished his first of many years as a swim team member at the time of Roth's death, is a 2008 graduate of Anderson High School and a past recipient of the "Roth Feeley Spirit Award."

In the summer of 1996, in honor of Roth Feeley, the Westover Swim Team was renamed the Westover Wild Orcas. Kristen Feeley designed the first Westover Wild Orca logo (the vintage design that will be our 2008 t-shirt). Every year the "Roth Feeley Spirit Award" is given to a Wild Orcas swimmer who best exemplifies leadership, enthusiasm, and most importantly, spirit.

Kristen says, "Our family was deeply moved by the honor bestowed upon our wonderful son, Roth, when the Westover family adopted the Orca as its mascot and established the "Roth Feeley Spirit Award." It was so perfect and Roth would have loved it. Roth's knowledge and love of whales, even as a kindergartener, was well-known in the community, partly because Roth was never shy to share. Our community embraced us, comforted us, and let us know that Roth would never be forgotten. We will be forever grateful. All the past recipients of the spirit award have renewed our pride and gratitude, for they are all outstanding young people of exceptional character and spirit. Every summer I see new swimmers and their families sporting Orca t-shirts and I smile and am grateful to the Westover family for the honor. Thank you all. Go Orcas!"
